EXTRACT FROM MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YUTAN, IN THE COUNTY OF SAUNDERS, STATE OF NEBRASKA WAS HELD AT THE YUTAN CITY OFFICE, YUTAN, NEBRASKA ON THE 1ST DAY OF DECEMBER 2017, AT 5:00 p.m.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by posting notice, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the (Affidavit of Publication) (Certificate of Posting Notice) attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to the Mayor and all members of the City Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by Mayor Egr. Mayor Egr opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Council members: Beck, Long, McLaughlin, and Peterson were present. Mayor Egr informed all of the individuals present of the location of the poster regarding the Open Meetings Act.

- 1) Discussion was held regarding the different options for the purchase of a vehicle for the Yutan Police Department. The purchase of an SUV, rather than another Dodge Charger, was suggested, but it was explained that switching the make and model of the vehicle used by the police department would cause a need to replace most, if not all, of the police equipment installed inside of the vehicle. It was emphasized by multiple members of the Council that it is vital to act quickly in order to get the police force a vehicle as soon as possible to restore regular patrols of the City. Councilmember Long presented an available 2016 Dodge Charger for sale. A motion was made by Long and seconded by McLaughlin to purchase the 2016 Dodge Charger he presented for an amount not to exceed \$30,000. Upon roll call vote was as follows: YEA: Long, McLaughlin and Peterson. NO: Beck. Motion carried.
- 2) Council discussion was held related to the pursuit and accident that led to the need for the purchase of a new police cruiser. Councilmember Long explained that he had meetings with the FBI and several members of law enforcement who reviewed the tape of the pursuit and commended Police Chief Hannan on his actions in the chase and eventual arrests of the bank robbery suspects.

Meeting was adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
